There is also a stand selling washable and reusable books in English, Urdu, Maths etc.



Looking ahead, the festival promises an exciting lineup of events, including workshops on puppetry and letter writing for children, and insightful discussions on the great poets & writers of Kashmir. Tomorrow at the Chinar Talks there will be a spotlight on filmy stalwarts Aswath Bhatt, Mir Sarwar, Hussein Khan, and Mushtaq Ali in a session moderated by RJ Vijdan on "Lights, Camera, Kashmir: Exploring Theatre and Acting as Career Paths".
