As part of state government's 'Vanche Gujarat' programme, Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) is all geared up to host the city's first ever National Book Fair, from today, in association with National Book Trust and with the support of Gujarat Prakashak Mandal. The inaugural function will start at 9 am at Sabarmati River Front near Vallabh Sadan.

The grand fest will be inaugrated by Chief Minister Narendra Modi in the presence of State Revenue Minister Anandiben Patel. Mayor Asit Vora others. May 1 also marks the 52nd Gujarat Foundation Day.

"We are very much delighted to welcome you at this National Book Fair. It is a proud moment for us as the fair will raise the status of our city. National Book Fair will be organised every year," said Municipal Commissioner Guruprasad Mohapatra.

Themed on 'literature' the intention of NBF is to inculcate reading habits among Amdavadis. The seven-day gala event will be attended by

publishers, distributors and sellers besides renowed writers and poets from across the country. The fair will also see various literary programmes and 'kavi goshtis'.

There will be as many as 200 stalls out of which 180 will be dedicated to book. It is learnt that the place will also have first aid counters within hall. The seven-day event will also see water sports activities in the Sabarmati and children's fun activities.
