

Kashi-Tamil Sangamam: Shared Knowledge, Shared Traditions

ome to myriad languages, cultural traditions and geographical landscapes, India has always been known as the quintessential melting pot. Shared heritage was and continues to be the defining feature of Indian society with developments in trade, travel and science further enhancing this process through the ages. One such aspect is the centuries old ties between Kashi and Tamil Nadu, currently being celebrated at the Kashi-Tamil Sangamam, being organised by the Ministry of Education, Government of India from 17th November to 16th December 2022. This significance was emphasised upon by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his inaugural address-"Confluence plays a very vital role in our country, from the confluence of rivers, knowledge and thoughts. This Sangamam is the celebration of India's diverse cultures."

It provides the roadmap for other states to explore similar cultural connections and amplify the message of *Ek Bharat*, *Shrestha Bharat*. The connection between the two ranges from the ancient times of the Pandyas to as recent as the foundation of BHU, one of the premier educational institutions of Kashi and to the present times where both exist in popular imagination as venerated seats of learning.

Rabindranath Tagore once said, "If God had so wished, he would have made all Indians speak with one language ... the unity of India has been and shall always be a unity in diversity." More than 19500 dialects are spoken today in the country with Kashi and Tamil Nadu being centres of the world's oldest languages—Sanskrit and Tamil. Luminaries like Subramania Bharati stayed in Kashi, learned Sanskrit and Hindi and enriched the local



culture thereby delivering lectures in Tamil. This kind of assimilation of different vibrant traditions enabled the making of a syncretic whole that characterises the cultural ethos of India.

The civilisational history of India places both Kashi and Tamil Nadu on a high pedestal for their contribution towards knowledge building, development of a vibrant linguistic tradition and the spread of spirituality. In the 15th Century, King Adhiveera Pandiyan, descendant of the dynasty which established Sivakasi, built the Shiva Temple in Tenkasi, south-western Tamil Nadu, for those devotees who couldn't visit Kashi. Much later in time, the revered Saint Kumaragurupara, born in Tirunelveli in the 17th century, wrote the Kashi Kalambakam, a grammatical

composition of poems on Kashi and established the Kumaraswamy Mutt. This exchange not only introduced the people of the two regions to different customs, it also made boundaries between traditions fluid and dynamic with parts of one flowing into the other. Kashi and Tamil Nadu have emerged as major temple cities, home to some of the most magnificent temples like the Kashi Vishwanath Temple and the Ramanathaswamy Temple. Renowned writer and businessman, S.M.L. Lakshmanan Chettiar (1921-1986) was born in Sivaganga and compiled about 20 Kumbabishekam volumes on major temples in India ranging from Kashi to Rameswaram. This feat was achieved after years of extensive travelling and absorbing the traditions of a hitherto foreign land. The National Education Policy of 2020 aspires to create a learning environment along these lines where learning is informed by traditions on one hand and scientific developments on the other, firmly rooted in indigenous knowledge and keeping pace with global advancements.

The linkages between the two regions span across realms and there has been a history of active academic, literary and artistic discourse between them. While Kashi exemplified Pandita Parampara, Tamil Nadu saw the rise of Tamil ilakkiaparambarai (Tamil literary tradition). Eminent personalities like CV Raman were present at the Foundation Ceremony of Banaras Hindu University and the former President of India, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan was its Vice- Chancellor. Both Kashi and Chennai have been recognised by UNESCO as Creative Cities of Music and this illustrious connection can be seen in how the legendary singer, actress and recipient of the Bharat Ratna, M.S. Subbulakshmi was trained by Kashi's celebrated Hindustani singer Siddheshwari Devi. The culture of a place can be best studied and defined by its aesthetic traditions and both these places have preserved and nurtured a rich corpus of shared art and literature.



The emergence and development of societies have since time immemorial taken place around the presence of rivers. Be it modes of transportation, trade and commerce or poetry, rivers occupy a central position in all realms. Kashi and Tamil Nadu are particularly distinct because of two of the mightiest rivers, Ganga and Kaveri, with the latter being popularly known as Dakshin Ganga. These riverine societies are centred around the sacredness of the rivers that flow through them, encompassing them in a kind of cultural and philosophical unity. It has not just shaped them socio-economically but has also resulted in major works of art and literature.

When the legacy that we inherit is one with such vibrant history and connection, the preservation of it assumes paramount importance. It is imperative that the knowledge of this shared heritage is passed down to the younger generations and they are provided with a perspective about India's cultural and civilisational ethos.

Mahatma Gandhi rightly said, "Our ability to reach unity in diversity will be the beauty and the test of our civilization." The Kashi-Tamil Sangamam is an effort to achieve this ideal. It is symbolic of the meeting of the two ends of the country, North and South. It is a place where students, teachers, professionals from all fields, and experts of culture and heritage come together and endeavour to keep alive the essence of this shared heritage and find avenues to create new ones.

This is being done through seminars and tours of Kashi, Ayodhya and Prayagraj for guests from Tamil Nadu on literature, archeology, history, music et cetera and book translations. Staying true to the artistic and cultural heritage of the two cities, the events also include Bharatanatyam and folk dance performances, exhibitions on art-culture, music and books and festivals based on South Indian food and Tamil films. India's identity is a result of centuries worth of assimilation and like the Kashi-Tamil strands, there are thousands of strands that make it the vital union that it is today.



NDWBF 2023 will have a centrallyplaced, specially designed Theme Pavilion on Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, commemorating 75 years of Indian Independence and the glorious history of its people, culture, and achievements put-up across 1000 sq.m. with special exhibits, exhibition of more than 750 titles on Freedom Fighters, National Movement of India, etc. in all major Indian languages and in English.

There will be a Digital Exhibition of

India's achievements during the last 75 years, an Events Corner for hosting panel discussions, books, and photo exhibitions, book releases, cultural events, etc.

The aesthetically-built Theme Pavilion is being designed by National Institute of



Design, Ahmedabad - the Design Partner of NDWBF.

Visitors to the fair will be able to browse through a number of books in many foreign languages put up by about 20 international exhibitors.

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
NBT-India Participates in Ganga Utsav - The River Festival




NBT-India Participates in UNESCO India-Africa Hackathon


