he Ganga is rightly called 'Maa' by Indians as the river plays a major role in the development of Indian civilisation. Life has blossomed along the river, and the Ganga has played an integral part in the development of the literary heritage of the country. The Upanishads were composed in a region by the river, Tulsidas composed the Ramcharitramanas on the banks of the river, and many great modern poets have come from cities by the river. The Ganga is mentioned several times in the Vedas, the Puranas, the Ramayana, and the Mahabharata. Literature, be it in oral or written form, has always flowed along the river. However, in recent times, we seem to have lost our connection with this great river and forgotten the literary heritage it carries with it. In doing so, we have lost out on literature in not just Hindi, but also Garhwali, Kumauni. Maithili, Urdu, Bhojpuri, Magahi, Khortha, Santali, Surjapuri, Tharu, and Bengali.

We, at NBT, understand the importance of diverse voices in literature and aim to promote and support regional as well as mainstream authors with the thought of encouraging reading habits in the country. With this goal in mind, we have launched the **Ganga Pustak Parikrama**.

Following the course of the Ganga, from Gangotri to the port of Haldia, visiting 20 cities with our book van to promote books written by local authors and celebrate the literary figures of the city. We aim to help people understand the literary heritage they come from.

The Ganga has played an instrumental role in changing the spiritual lives of many, and helped people reevaluate their

lives and live in a better way. This has been recorded in many books written by people- fiction and non-fiction with the Ganga predominantly symbolising change and rejuvenation in many books. However, the holy river and all who depend on it are now threatened by pollution. Despite multiple efforts to fight the pollution, we still have a long way to go.

The **Namami Ganga Project** is the largest effort made yet to preserve the life-line of our country. It has launched multiple schemes for restoration in order to save our lifeline.

Under the **Gyan Ganga** initiative, NBT aims to preserve, celebrate, and encourage the flow of knowledge along the river. The river has had many eminent writers and personalities living by it and the Ganga Pustak Parikrama aims to combine the literary heritage of the Ganga along with its cultural heritage.

Under the **Jan Ganga** initiative we wish to spread awareness about the rivers heritage and the urgent need for its conservation to as many people as possible by hosting events in the cities we visit.

Join us as we flow along and discover the hidden literary gems embedded by the banks of the river.

Events and Activities

The Ganga Pustak Parikrama will make its way to each city as per the itinerary outlined in this brochure. Besides providing a treasure trove of books for all to read, we will also host events and activities for every age group at each destination in the following format:

Day 1: Story-telling session and discussions on literature written on the Ganga

Day 2: Drawing and quiz competitions for students

Day 3: A spirited marathon and book donation drive

We are also inviting environmentalists, spiritual leaders, professors, and academics to share their views on the cultural significance of the Ganga in India and the need to conserve it.

With these events we hope to capture the unique spirit of each city and the deep bond they share with the holy river. A few special drawings prepared by the students will be featured in a commemorative book published by NBT titled, "Voyage of the Ganga".

As the Knowledge Partner of the Country, we will fulfil our role in creating a fun environment of learning and awareness as we flow along on our journey by the river. In this voyage, spanning 20 cities and 80 days, we will reach out to more than a thousand schools, and we are expected to host over 1.5 lakh students as well as over 3 lakh general attendees.

I. Uttarkashi (Gangotri)

03 Oct to 06 Oct 2022

Uttarkashi, the site where the river originates in the city of Gangotri, is a place of great importance in Hindu culture. Many people visit the town on pilgrimage. It also has many lakes.

The Government District Library, founded in 1964, and renovated in 2021 contains over 45,000 books.

It is also home to **Bachendri Pal**, who in 1984 became the first Indian woman to reach the summit of Mount Everest. She chronicles her journey in her autobiography Everest – My Journey to the Top.

Rishikesh


08 Oct to 10 Oct 2022

The Gurukula Kangri University or Gurukul Kangri Vishwavidyalaya is located on the bank of the Ganga. It was founded on 4 March 1902, with the sole aim to revive the ancient Indian gurukul system of education.

Here, we can also find the Hastinapur Wildlife Sanctuary which is a protected area in the Gangetic plains of Uttar Pradesh, to preserve the biodiversity of the region.

Many award-winning authors like Ismat Chugtai, Jainendra Kumar, Sved Fazl-ul-Hasan, and Rashid Jahan are from Aligarh.

Farrukhabad

25 Oct to 27 Oct 2022

A city of great historical relevance, the history of Farrukhabad can be traced back to the Bronze age. The traditional history of the district from the earliest times till the end of The Mahabharata war is gleaned from the Puranas Mahabharata. It is the birthplace of Mahadevi Varma, who is considered one of the four major pillars of the Chhayawadi era in Hindi literature. She was a poet, essayist, sketch story writer and an eminent personality of Hindi literature. Dr. Zakir **Husain**, the 3rd President of India. also hails from Farrukhabad.



Prayagraj is home to many notable authors who are part of the Chhayavad movement, like Harivansh Rai Bachchan, Suryakant Tripathi "Nirala", Subhadra Kumari Chauhan, and Pandit Narendra Sharma. It is also home to poets like Syed Akbar Hussain, and Ibn-e-Safi.

Prayagraj also celebrates his literary heritage with The Allahabad Public Library. The Allahabad Museum was opened to the public in 1954. The Museum has 16 galleries with various displays including textiles, modern Indian painting, armours and bronze, as well as a gallery for the Freedom Struggle.

Varanasi


08 Nov to 11 Nov 2022

Varanasi has been associated with learning and spiritualism for ages. There is no better example of the connection between the river and literary output than Tulsidas, who composed his masterwork the Hanuman Chalisa and the epic Ramcharitmanas on the banks of the river, which resulted in the ghat being aptly named Tulsi Ghat. Another renowned poet is Kabir Das whose writings influenced Hinduism's Bhakti movement and his verses are found in Sikhism's scripture Guru Granth Sahib, Satguru Granth Sahib of Saint Garib Das and Kabir Sagar.

Premchand, who was a pioneer of Hindi and Urdu social fiction, Bharatendu Harishchandra who is often considered the father of Hindi literature and Hindi theatre are also from Varanasi, and Jaishankar Prasad, a Chhyavadi poet are also from Varanasi.

The Ganga Mahotsav which happens every year on the ghats of the Ganga attracts many artists and performers who showcase the cultural heritage of the country through their performances.

The **Kachhua Sanctuary** is home to many water animals like turtles and the Gangetic dolphin. These creatures are also at risk of extinction and learning about them is a crucial step in saving them.


13. Patna

14. Begusarai

22 Nov to 24 Nov 2022

Begusarai is the birthplace of rashtrakavi Ramdhari Singh Dinkar who emerged as a voice to be reckoned with during the Freedom Struggle and Balmiki Prasad Singh who was the 14th Governor of Sikkim and has written a number of books and articles relating to Indian culture.

The Kanwar Lake Bird Sanctuary or Kanwar Taal, is formed by a tributary of the Ganga and is home to 60 migratory birds and around 106 species of resident birds.

15. Sultanganj

26 Nov to 28 Nov 2022

Sultanganj is thought to be the abode of the sage Jahnu. The hill that contained the Ashram of Jahnu is still present in the middle of the Ganga and at present the famous Shiva temple of Ajgaivinath is situated on the summit.

The Ganga ghat in Sultanganj is a site of great importance to the city. It also has the **Vikramshila Dolphin Sanctuary**, home to the Gangetic dolphin, the National Aquatic Animal of India.

16.Bhagalpur

30 Nov to 02 Dec 2022

Situated on the banks of the Ganga, Bhagalpur was the site of historic Vikramashila University, one of the three most important Buddhist monasteries in India during the Pala Empire, along with Nalanda and Odantapuri. Till now, it has been the birthplace of many literary personalities like, Saratchandra Chattopadhyay, a famous Bengali novelist whose novel Srikanth is based on Bhagalpur, Dr Lutfur Rehman, and Dibyendu Pal. It is also where Kadambini Bose Ganguly, one of the first Indian female doctors who practised with a degree in modern medicine, hails from. She was also the first woman speaker in the Indian National Congress.

17. Sahibganj

04 Dec to 06 Dec 2022

Mentioned in the notes of Megasthenes in 302 BC and Chinese traveller Hiuen Tsang in 645 AD, Sahibganj is a place of historical and cultural importance. This is seen in the great forts of Teliagarhi Fort and Rajmahal Fort. Sahibganj is also a place of environmental importance as it has the Udhwa Lake Bird Sanctuary.


